## What is this product?

**Type:** This product is a structured note.

**Objectives:** This product is designed to provide (1) a return in the form of semiannual variable interest amounts paid on Interest Payment Dates and calculated by reference to the relative level of 6 month Euribor (Underlying) on Interest Determination Dates, and (2) a cash payment of the Product Notional amount on the maturity date. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the maturity date.

**Interest amounts:** on each Interest Payment Date you will receive an interest payment of EUR: Product Notional amount \* Interest Rate.

**Interest Rate:** A per annum rate equal to 6 month Euribor plus 3.75%, subject to a floor of 3.75% and a cap of 6.50%

**Termination on the maturity date:** On termination of the product on the maturity date, you will receive the Product Notional amount.

**Underlying:** 6 month Euribor: Euro Interbank Offered Rate (the benchmark rate of Euro money markets) with designated maturity 6 months.

**Interest Determination Dates:** Two TARGET Settlement Days preceding the first day of each calculation period.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying index, the product and the product issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

**Intended investor:** The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who fulfil all of the criteria below:

1. they have the ability to make an informed investment decision through sufficient knowledge and understanding of the product and its specific risks and rewards, with experience of investing in and/or holding a number of similar products providing a similar market exposure, either independently or through professional advice;
2. they seek income and/or full principal protection, subject to the issuer's ability to pay, expect the movement in the underlying to perform in a way that generates a favourable return and have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below;
3. they accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product but otherwise they are not able to bear any loss of their investment; and

### What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until the agreed settlement date.

You may not be able to end your product early. You may have to pay significant extra costs to end your product early.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class. Be aware of currency risk. In case that the currency of the country that you purchased the note is different than the currency of the note, you may receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above. You are entitled to receive back at least 100.00 % of your capital. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash-in before the Maturity date. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment. ### What happens if the Bank is unable to pay out?

### What are the costs?

### How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?

#### Recommended Holding Period: 2 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under “1. What is this product?” above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until maturity.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product, either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. No fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction; however, an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
